We hope to complete the project later this year.



Another project that we are focused on is replacing Engine 27-2, a project that has been tabled for several years as we focused on construction of the new building.

Normally we aim to replace apparatus on a 20-year replacement cycle, staggering the purchases so that, in theory, we are only replacing apparatus every five years. Several factors can throw that schedule off, such as our major building project did, and in many cases we keep our apparatus longer than 20 years, however; at this time, Engine 27-2 (a 1994 GMC Topkick 4x4) is 26 years old and we want to ensure our apparatus is ready and capable when needed.

We have been working with several manufacturers to help guide us in designing a mini-pumper, that would replace our current Engine 27-2. Much like the GMC Topkick, it would have off-road capabilities, but it will be smaller in profile and be better able to access the rural, wooded locations we serve more efficiently than a larger piece of apparatus. Additionally, overall, we are operating with fewer volunteers than we were in 1994 when we purchased our current Engine 27-2. A smaller profile engine, such as a mini-pumper, will require less manpower to operate and be easier to operate.

While we have not decided on an exact model/design and therefore cannot quote a price, we are looking at a purchase price of about \$280,000.00, costing considerably less than a traditional size engine. We anticipate that we will be able to use the mini-pumper, not only for locations where traditional apparatus may not be able to access, but also for some of our non-fire responses where we are currently responding with Engine 27-1, but not needing all the capabilities of that piece, thus saving wear and tear on Engine 27-1.
